\$2.9 Million in Capital Needs Identified Over Next Two Years

With our commitment for infrastructure complete and no new projects in the works, LWDHF can focus all its energy on raising funds for capital equipment. The government does not offer any type of matching fund programs for equipment, so LWDHF is left to raise the funds dollar for dollar.

\$2.9 million in capital equipment needs have been identified by LWDH over the next two years. Some pieces are for preventative care such as the colonoscope and digital mammography unit. Others monitor patient's well-being such as the vital signs monitors and wireless EKG. Watch for future e-newsletters highlighting the importance of this new equipment.
